Applications open for Gwinnett Youth Commission through April 12

High schoolers can apply for the next Gwinnett Youth Commission through Monday, April 12. The Gwinnett Youth Commission is a program to develop youth leaders to speak on behalf of their peers, help County government leaders better understand youth issues, plan community events, and participate in volunteer projects.

High school sophomores, juniors, and seniors can take part in the Gwinnett Youth Commission, which consists of an eight-

week training session and a graduation, at which participants are sworn-in as youth commissioners.

To be eligible for the commission, students must be a resident of Gwinnett County, be a rising sophomore, junior, or senior at a Gwinnett high school, and submit a completed <u>application</u> and a typed essay by the April 12 deadline.

Weekly sessions are expected to take place in person; however, to keep everyone safe and allow for social distancing, the class size will be reduced to 15 participants. Masks will be required.

Chairwoman Hendrickson delivers first State of the County Address

In her first State of the County address Gwinnett County Commission Chairwoman Nicole Hendrickson on March 3 lauded the County's pursuit of excellence called the "Gwinnett Standard."

"You may not have heard the phrase the 'Gwinnett Standard,' but I can guarantee you've felt it," Hendrickson said. "What's normal here would be awesome almost

anyplace else. What's ordinary in Gwinnett is extraordinary elsewhere."

County extends emergency rental assistance program

The Gwinnett Board of Commissioners recently announced that the County will use more than \$28.1 million in stimulus funds from the federal Emergency Rental Assistance Program to launch an extension of its Project RESET eviction prevention program.

Project RESET — developed last fall by Chief Magistrate Kristina Hammer Blum, District 4 Commissioner Marlene Fosque and HomeFirst Gwinnett's Matt Elder — used CARES Act funding to make past-due rent payments directly to landlords in order to prevent imminent evictions and keep tenants stably housed. As of March 12, the program has assisted 849 households with more than \$3.75 million in rental assistance for those affected by COVID-19.

The extension will allow applicants to seek financial support for past-due utility payment assistance as well as past-due rent.

Applications for this program will open in late April. Payments will be made directly to landlords and utility providers for past-due balances.

Tenants and landlords interested in participating in this program can access the Frequently Asked Questions at <u>GCGA.us/RentalAssistance</u> to learn more about the program and begin collecting required documents for the application submission.

Households in immediate need are encouraged to seek resources currently available in the community at GCGA.us/COVID19Resources.

Find vaccine information

The Georgia Department of Public Health has the latest information about the COVID-19 vaccines.

The <u>state's COVID-19 vaccination page</u> includes a <u>Vaccine Locator tool</u> to find sites that are currently providing vaccinations; a status

dashboard where you can see data about the amount of vaccines allocated, shipped, and administered to Georgians; and a list of locations where appointments are available.

All Georgians 16 and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. You can pre-register for vaccination at one of the state's mass vaccination sites at MyVaccineGeorgia.com.

If you're looking for a <u>COVID-19 vaccination site near you</u>, be sure to check back often as the participating vaccine site locations list will be updated frequently. Additional locations statewide will be added when providers are ready to safely administer the vaccine, and as vaccine supply allows.
