Across the country, Pride Month is recognized in June to commemorate the Stonewall riots, which was a turning point for the Gay Liberation Movement in the United States. In Gwinnett County, we celebrate Pride Month to affirm our support to our LGBTQ+ community.

Additionally, the County will commemorate Juneteenth with several festivals and celebrations throughout Gwinnett.

Celebrate Juneteenth in Gwinnett County



Juneteenth is the oldest celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. This year marks the first time that Gwinnett County will officially recognize Juneteenth as a County holiday, which means that County government offices, with the exception of those required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed Monday, June 20.

The United Ebony Society of Gwinnett and Gwinnett County Government will celebrate Juneteenth with a

day of fun for the entire family, **Saturday**, **June 18** at Rhodes Jordan Park from **11:00am to 9:00pm**. This year's Juneteenth festival includes historical presentations, performances, music, games, and food trucks. Rhodes Jordan Park is located at 100 East Crogan Street in Lawrenceville.
