Register to vote by February 12

To vote in the March 12 Presidential Preference Primary, ensure you're registered. The deadline to register to vote is Monday, February 12. Georgia residents wishing to register must be U.S. citizens, legal residents of their voting county, and at least 18 years of age by Election Day. Check your registration status, download a voter registration application, view sample ballots, and locate your polling location at MVP.SOS.GA.gov.

Happening Around Gwinnett

Board of Commissioners adopts 2024 budget

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners approved a \$2.53 billion budget to fund County operations and projects for the year. The approved budget consists of a \$1.97 billion operating budget and a \$561 million capital improvements budget, which includes funds from the County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program. Initiatives in the budget include expanding microtransit zones, Economic Development Division expansion, a biosolids dryer at the F. Wayne Hill Water Resources Center, adding 12 firefighters



to staff a new ambulance and alternative response vehicle, adding 12 new E-911 communications officers, and increased pay for elections poll officials.

As part of the budget development process, department directors and elected officials presented business plans for 2024 to six Gwinnett residents recruited by Chairwoman Hendrickson, who reviewed the departmental requests and made recommendations. Gwinnett adds 10 new glass recycling sites

Gwinnett County and Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful, in partnership with Ripple Glass, have added 10 new glass recycling locations across the county, totaling 13 sites. The County's glass recycling program allows residents to drop off glass for safe and sustainable recycling.

The newest locations for District 2 are Lucky Shoals Park in Norcross, Mountain Park Aquatic Center in Stone Mountain, and Bethesda Park in Lawrenceville. The previous location of One

Stop Norcross adds up to four glass recycling sites in District 2. The newest locations are in addition to the previous three containers at One Stop Norcross, Pinckneyville Park in Norcross, and E.E. Robinson Park in Sugar Hill.
