Advanced voting for the General Primary and Nonpartisan General Election starts April 29 The General Primary and Nonpartisan General Election Day is on Tuesday, May 21. Registered voters can vote advance in person every day, including weekends, from April 29 to May 17 from 7:00am to 7:00pm at the Gwinnett Voter Registrations and Elections office in Lawrenceville and nine advance voting locations around the county.

Voting by mail is another option available for voters. You can

request an absentee by mail ballot for the May 21 election now through Friday, May 10. Please complete the absentee ballot application form online or call the Voter Registrations and Elections Office at 678.226.7210 to request an application. The voter registration deadline for the General Primary and Nonpartisan General Election is April 22. To check the status of your voter registration, see a sample

# What's New in District 4

### New Sensory Treehouse opens in Buford

County leaders joined together to open the new Sensory Treehouse at the Gwinnett Environmental and Heritage Center in March. Made of weathering Corten steel, this treehouse offers a unique experience for people with mobility disabilities to enjoy the tree canopy. It features a 340-foot accessible steel walkway with three expanded nodes, surrounded by a viewing and activity platform and a high-hanging hammock.



After years of planning, the updated Blue Planet film debuted at the Sensory Treehouse, emphasizing environmental education

and sustainability. The \$4.7 million total cost of the treehouse and film projects were funded by the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program, known as SPLOST.
